	the Academy program against the highest preference program only in their application portal. It

If I register for BITS RMIT Academy, would that alter anything from my course preferences for the Indian campuses?	You are able to preference and apply to the BITS Indian campuses and the BITS-RMIT Higher Education Academy separately. Preferencing the Academy program will not impact your preference for the BITS Pilani Indian campuses.
	If you are interested in the BITS-RMIT Academy, please submit your application now - it will not impact your preferences or opportunities for direct entry to the BITS Indian campuses. Does BITSAT score matter in the admission process?	Applicants who meet the minimum academic requirements will be ranked based on their moderated Final BITSAT score. Offers will be issued to the top ranked applicants down, until places are filled.
What happens if I can't transfer to Melbourne at the end of year 2?	This International Dual Degree Programme is structured to include two years of study at BITS Pilani, followed by two years at the RMIT University in Australia, culminating in the award of degrees from both institutions. However, if you are unable to proceed to RMIT due to compelling reasons, the following alternatives may be considered at the sole discretion of BITS Pilani: a) BITS Pilani may, at its sole discretion, reassign you to a new programme depending on your BITSAT-2025 score and its position in the regular merit list prepared for students admitted to First Degree programmes through BITSAT-2025 (and not through the BITS-RMIT International Dual Degree route).
	 b) BITS Pilani may certify your completed coursework for credit transfer to another recognized institution, which may consider it towards awarding a degree, subject to their norms. c) You may be offered the option to continue and complete your degree at the BITS Pilani Dubai Campus. In such cases, you will be required to pay the fees applicable to the Dubai Campus.

Students who successfully complete all four years of the BITS-RMIT Higher Education Academy dual degree programs will be eligible to receive degrees from both BITS Pilani and RMIT University. Both RMIT and BITS Pilani have worked carefully together to align our program offerings, and each will recognise the study completed at the other institution, enabling completion of requirements for each degree. The degrees will be the same as the standard degrees from each institution - students will receive two separate testamurs (Transcripts) and degree certificates, one from each university.

PRACTICE SCHOOL AND WORK IN AUSTRALIA

Both RMIT and BITS recognise the importance of Work-Integrated Learning (WIL)/Practice School (WIL/PS) for preparing work-ready graduates in an increasingly competitive workforce market.

RMIT programs have industry engaged WIL activities involving students interacting with organisations (industry, government and community) through discipline relevant projects and/or work placements.

What about Practice School? Would I have the option to take internships at RMIT?

Students will have the option to work on industry projects that are co-designed with industry and/or community partners. -world problems or address the needs of the industry or community. Industry partners are engaged in the project and co-supervise the student/activities with RMIT academics. All engineering programs have Capstone courses in their final year, where students work on industry related projects. Some of these projects provide students with an opportunity be co-supervised by industry mentors to gain additional practical experience. For students who are interested in further studies in research training and careers in academia and research institutions, supervised individual or team research projects can be offered as part of their capstone experience

Some RMIT courses may have WIL activities in simulated workplace environments that are designed to simulate real workplaces in their function, equipment and mode of operation so that students can experience a variety of scenarios.

In addition, in most programs, the students will have an option to enroll in the Professional Engineering Experience course and complete paid/unpaid industry placements normally undertaken during a semester break (subject to the student securing a placement that meet the requirements of the course and in accordance with vi visa conditions by the Australian government

Students going to Australia under Visa Subclass 500 are eligible to work for up to 48 hours in a fortnight while the course is in session and for unlimited hours when the course is not in session (during breaks). Please note the government advice can change. Always refer to the Australian Immigration site for more up to date information. Please also note that as of July 2024 there will be changes to the Temporary Graduate visa program. The length of stay for Indian nationals, as agreed in the Australia India – Economic Cooperation and Trade Agreement (AI-ECTA), is as follows: • Bachelor degree (including honours) – 2 years • Bachelor degree (with first class honours in STEM, including ICT) – 3 years • Masters (coursework, extended and research) – 3 years Doctoral degrees (PhD) – 4 years.
